Mormon church construction underway

A s the Maui Lani area continues to flourish, new additions are being made to accommodate the growing community. One of the newest additions to the community will include a 26,000 square feet Mormon church that will be located along the Maui Lani Parkway.

"This meetinghouse is being built to meet the needs of a growing Latterday Saints population in the Central

Maui area," said Kahului Hawaii Stake President, Arnold Wunder.

The building will not only be functioning as the church's new stake center, but also as a multi-purpose hall for large events.

The general contractor of the project, Jacobsen Construction, is from Oahu and the GYA Architects, who designed the building are from Wailuku. The building will house a large chapel with overflow area, a multi-purpose cultural hall, multiple classrooms, and administrative offices. Completion date of the church is projected to be in early December of this year.

The current meetinghouse of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints is the home of four congregations, and is located at 125 Kamehameha Avenue in Kahului. That facility will remain operational and will continue to be used as another meetinghouse once the new stake center has been finished.

The Dunes - A Hawaiian Links by Jack Byrne

The game of linksland golf carries a voice with a brogue all its own and on the links of The Dunes at Maui Lani you can virtually hear the rolling "r"s. Robin Nelson's vision was to create an Irish links-style course in concept, keeping in mind the grasses and humidity factors in Hawaii are totally different than those found in the British Isles.

What is a true links course? According to the USGA: "Links is a term that refers to a very specific geographic land form found in Scotland. Such tracts of low-lying, seaside land are characteristically sandy, treeless and undulating, often with lines of dunes or dune ridges, and covered by bent grass and gorse (a spiney yellow-flowered Old World evergreen shrub." From the Middle Ages onward, linkslands (generally speaking, poor land for farming) were common grounds used for sports, including archery, bowls and golf. Because many of the early courses of Scotland were built on these common linksland, golf courses and links have forever been associated. The term "links" is commonly misapplied to refer to any golf course. But remember that a true links depends only on geography."
